## About Learn Without Limits CIC

Learn Without Limits CIC is a Wales-based, parent-led organisation working to improve how families navigate Additional Learning Needs (ALN), EOTAS, home education, safeguarding and transition systems.

Our work combines practical parent guidance, safeguarding-aware information, public policy interpretation, events and workshops, digital resources, and our emerging Prevent -> Bridge -> Progress model.

Over the past year, our public-facing work has expanded significantly through a growing specialist blog and knowledge base, quarterly open-call briefings, community engagement across Wales, and the ongoing development of preventative navigation infrastructure designed around real user journeys.

We are now looking for trusted Community Champions and Public Engagement Volunteers who can help strengthen visibility, connection and constructive dialogue across Wales.

## Why This Role Matters

Families navigating ALN and related systems often feel isolated, overwhelmed or unheard.

At Learn Without Limits CIC, we believe that practical information, prevention, safeguarding, relationships and constructive public engagement all matter.

We are looking for people who can help amplify the work of Learn Without Limits CIC in a calm, grounded and community-focused way.

This role is not about becoming “the face” of the organisation. It is about helping strengthen trust, open constructive conversations, encourage engagement, communicate parent-informed systems insight responsibly, and help more people understand why preventative navigation infrastructure matters.

We are especially interested in people who can communicate clearly without centring themselves.

## What the Role Involves

Community Champions and Public Engagement Volunteers may help with: sharing blog articles, events and resources; helping amplify key messages and campaigns; supporting respectful community engagement; welcoming people into discussions, workshops or briefings; encouraging constructive dialogue online or in person; helping people feel connected to the wider community; attending occasional events or briefings where appropriate; introducing Learn Without Limits CIC to relevant networks; supporting outreach into community, civic, professional or policy-adjacent spaces; and representing the values of Learn Without Limits CIC positively and professionally. Some volunteers may also help identify emerging themes or concerns within the community, strengthen local connections, support engagement in underrepresented areas, or help build bridges between families, professionals and wider stakeholders.

## **What This Role Is Not**

This is **not** a formal advocacy, safeguarding or legal-advice role.

Community Champions and Public Engagement Volunteers are not expected to manage crises, provide professional advice, speak outside agreed boundaries, or represent personal views as organisational policy.

This is also not an influencer or ego-led ambassador role. It is message-disciplined public engagement, not personal campaigning.

We are looking for people who communicate thoughtfully, listen well, respect safeguarding boundaries, can work from agreed messaging and understand collaborative working.

Support, guidance and briefing will be provided by the Learn Without Limits CIC team.

## **Who This Role May Suit**

This role may suit someone who communicates warmly and confidently, enjoys connecting people and ideas, values safeguarding and respectful dialogue, understands the pressures many families face, can remain calm in emotionally sensitive discussions, enjoys community-building and wants to help strengthen constructive public conversation around ALN and related systems in Wales.

It may particularly suit someone who is already comfortable in: community settings; civic spaces; professional networks; third-sector conversations; education, disability or family-support networks; local government or public-service environments; or policy-adjacent spaces. Existing civic, professional, community or policy-adjacent networks are welcomed, but not required.

We would especially welcome people who can help open conversations, introduce the work to relevant networks, represent agreed messaging with warmth, discipline and humility, amplify parent-informed insight without speaking over families, support constructive engagement across different parts of Wales, and help more families, professionals and stakeholders discover the work.

Welsh speakers or people interested in helping strengthen bilingual and culturally aware community engagement across Wales would be especially welcomed.

Lived experience of ALN, disability, neurodivergence, caring, EOTAS, home education or related systems would also be welcomed, but is not essential.

Most importantly, we are looking for people who communicate clearly, understand collaborative working, are comfortable representing agreed values and messaging, can build trust without making themselves the centre of the story, and want to help build a constructive, prevention-focused community culture.

## **Safeguarding Requirement**

Community Champions and Public Engagement Volunteers must be willing to undertake an online Level 2 safeguarding course if they do not already hold suitable recent safeguarding training.

This helps ensure that public engagement, community conversations and event support remain aligned with

Learn Without Limits CIC's safeguarding-aware approach.

## **Time Commitment**

Flexible.

Most Community Champions and Public Engagement Volunteers contribute in ways that fit around work, caring responsibilities or other commitments.

There is no expectation of constant availability.

## **What We Offer**

This is an opportunity to help strengthen a growing Wales-based public-interest programme at an important stage of development.

Community Champions and Public Engagement Volunteers help strengthen community trust, improve visibility and engagement, support constructive public conversations, help families feel less alone while navigating complex systems, and build bridges between lived experience, professional understanding and wider public-policy conversations.

The role also offers opportunities to contribute to meaningful public-interest work, develop confidence and communication skills, support safeguarding-aware community engagement, and become part of a growing parent-informed network across Wales.
